How Charity Wills funds helped Fraser (5) in Angus...

Fraser (5) has guadruple cerebral palsy, and requires constant support to remain upright.

At the start of the pandemic, Fraser was put on the shielding list, meaning that he was unable to go on walks to the park due to how busy they were. Unfortunately, Fraser's wheelchair was not suitable for alternative terrains.

Cash for Kids granted Fraser a specialist buggy, suitable for all terrains which would provide him with the constant support necessary while also allowing him to visit safe, guieter areas like the beach and the woods. The buggy also has a storage area for Frasers feeding pump, meaning he is no longer limited for how long he can go out and explore the countryside!

How Charity Wills funds have helped children through the holidays Dundee...

Children between the ages of 11-15 years who's families are struggling financially due to the current ongoing pandemic, with job losses and shortages were one target of the funds raised by our Charity Wills campaign.

Children who attend the holiday provision receive a nutritious lunch along with being able to take part in fun activities they haven't experienced previously for example the cinema.

These children have been struggling with school and anxieties, the holiday provision allows these children to communicate and build relationships effectively.

Perth



How Charity Wills funds have helped babies and young families in Perth...

Due to the ongoing pandemic many families have been affected and are struggling financially unable to purchase essentials for their babies.

Buttons and Bows Baby Bank host weekly sessions and provide everything families need for their babies 0-5 years from nappies, food and equipment.

The Perth initiative funded by your donations have been a significant source of support, with over 250 families using the service every week.



How Charity Wills funds community support for Children in Fife...

The Larick Centre in Tayport wanted to combat the struggles with mental health that young people had been facing within the community, due to the impact of COVID and the limited services available. With this in mind, Cash for Kids granted The Larick Centre with the funds to purchase various sports equipment, including netball, basketball and badminton supplies, for the centre to set up a weekly sports club for the young people in the area.

This has allowed for structure which has not only been beneficial for the mental health of the locals, but has also led to a reduction in anti-social behaviour within the community!
